HELLO 2021

This year will again be very important in the journey of the renewal of Ebury Bridge. Below are a few of the things we can look forward to in 2021.

- ▶ The new community facilities at Ebury Edge will be available for residents to use. A community hall and spacious courtyard will be the location for activities and events for us all to enjoy as the days start getting longer. Please note, this is subject to government restrictions.
- ▶ The Ebury Edge units are also filling up with keen and innovative start-up businesses and Fat Macy's, the café operator at the new meanwhile space, has opened its doors to the public. On the next page we show you who is calling the new meanwhile space their home for now, so you can visit as and when government restrictions allow.
- ▶ We will see a decision made on the planning application, which was submitted last July. The application was the culmination of the hard work and feedback of local residents. Should permission be granted, it will pave the way for the delivery of the new homes.
- ▶ As building work continues there will be opportunities for new exciting pop-up play spaces and facilities for people of all ages to enjoy. Keep an eye out for how you can help us shape these new spaces.
- ▶ In late summer, we hope to see Bouygues – the principle contractor – arrive on site to start construction on Phase 1, delivering 226 new homes, and getting a better picture of the new Ebury Bridge.
- ▶ We are working to provide fun and educational initiatives at Ebury with our partners, for you, while the construction takes place – stay tuned!

FAT MACY'S OPEN THEIR DOORS

We are delighted to announce that new Ebury Edge café, Fat Macy's is now officially open to the public.

Fat Macy's arrived at Ebury in October last year, after being chosen to operate in the café of Ebury Edge. They have been busy preparing their wholesome and delicious menu for the local community and are now ready for you to come on in (and takeaway).

As well as producing delicious food, Fat Macy's also help young Londoners take on new skills, find work and settle into permanent accommodation as well, as part of their charitable arm.

RELOCATION OF THE FOODBANK

You may have noticed that the Foodbank Team has recently been relocated from the Lodge to where Wellesley and Wainwright Houses once stood. Visitors can now access the Foodbank via the path next to Bucknill House. This is to allow gas and groundworks be completed in the area near to the Lodge.

We understand how important the service Mike and his Team offer is to the surrounding community, and we will continue to support them now and into the future.

If you are new to the site and require the Foodbank Team's service, then their new location is highlighted on the map on the right for you. Please be aware that there is a live construction site around this area, consequently you must vigilant when accessing the Estate and look out for signposts and safety information.



CONSTRUCTION HAPPENING NOW AND IN THE COMING WEEKS

The start of 2021 is all systems go for construction at Ebury.

John F Hunt has placed hoarding and scaffolding around Pimlico House, as they prepare for the demolition of this block, making it now part of the construction site. The demolition work is scheduled to start in early February.

Work will also start soon to remove the foundation of Hillersdon House. Due to start in the coming weeks, John F Hunt will install 'sheet piling' using a vibrating technique which may create low level noise during working hours. This method is scheduled to last two days and has been chosen to minimise noise and vibration on the Estate while John F Hunt remove the foundations over the coming weeks. Thank you in advance for your understanding during these works.

SIGN UP TO HELP VACCINATE PEOPLE OF WESTMINSTER

A team of 200 people are being recruited to help give the coronavirus vaccine to residents in Westminster.

The Westminster Employment Service is working to recruit people to the two temporary mass vaccination centres in Westminster – Lord's Cricket Ground and the South Westminster Centre for Health in Pimlico.

The roles include full and part-time jobs.

They include immunisers who will get full training to vaccinate people with the coronavirus vaccine as part of the UK's biggest mass vaccination programme.

They will be paid £14.83 an hour.

Other roles include front-of-house, who help direct people, at £12.18 an hour, and administrators, who will be paid £13.10 an hour.

It is part of the nationwide aim to vaccinate as many people as possible, with the aim of delivering 15m vaccines to the over 80s and health care workers by the end of February.

COVID-19 TESTING IN WESTMINSTER

Testing is the most effective way to control the spread of the coronavirus.

The council offer two types of testing: for people who have symptoms and for people who are not showing symptoms.

Symptom-free testing is available at the following locations seven days a week:

- ▶ Little Venice Sports Centre, 10 Crompton Street, London, W2 1ND - 10am to 4pm.
- ▶ Westminster Cathedral Hall, Ambrosden Avenue, Westminster, London SW1P 1QH - 10am to 4pm.
- ▶ Moberly Sports Centre, 25 Chamberlayne Rd, Ladbroke Grove, Kensal Green, London NW10 3NB - 10am to 4pm.

The following semi-permanent, walk-through testing centres for people who have symptoms are open seven days a week, from 8am to 8pm, on an appointment only basis:

- ▶ Greenside Community Centre, 24 Lilestone St, Marylebone, London NW8 8SR.
- ▶ Grosvenor Hall, Vincent Street, London SW1P 4HB.

- ▶ Lydford Tenants and Residents Hall, 74 Fernhead Road, London W9 3EW.

You can only be tested if you have pre-booked an appointment that can be booked online on the NHS website via the following link nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19 or by calling **NHS 119**.

Westminster is working flat out to support the coronavirus vaccination programme with test centres and vaccination sites.

As throughout the pandemic, our vulnerable and shielding residents are the council's priority. Together with our frontline staff working around the clock, we are lucky to have more than 3,000 local people volunteering to help the community as part of the Westminster Connects scheme. They will once again be carrying bags, fetching shopping and conducting pharmacy runs for those who can't leave their homes.
