What date will it be opened?

50 years from the ceremony – Thursday 25 October 2074

Where is it located?

Underneath phase one of the new Ebury. A plaque will be placed near Mandeville apartments to mark the capsule.

What's inside?

Resident and CPG contributions: Photographs, poems and letters.

Audio/Visual: Site plans, Community Chest Summer Programme video, construction time-lapse on a USB stick.

Cultural and social aspects: Insights into local leisure activities, school, social media from St Barnabas School Year 6 pupils.

Historical context: Ebury history, newsletters, newspapers from the day and our currently used currency.

This was an opportunity for the team to update families about the next key steps in viewings and allocations of the new homes in phase one. The team has now completed the most recent residents' Housing Needs surveys to ensure we can provide viewings based on your preferences.

The viewings will take place between December and January, and you will then be able to agree on your move in date.
