Report Repairs and Defects at Mandeville Apartments

If you have a repair or defect inside your home, you can contact the Council's aftercare team by phone, email or on our website.

The Aftercare Team can be contacted by:

A defect is when any fixtures, fittings or where parts have failed from the construction or design. For example: doors that do not open or close correctly, extractor fans not working, or seals around showers leaking.

A repair includes other faults and issues within your home that the council undertakes to keep your home in good working order. Repairs which the Council undertakes and which tenants are responsible for are listed in the tenants handbook.

Repairs and defects are reported in the same way, but dealt with differently after that.



Details for reporting repairs and defects are in page 3 of your home user guide received at move in or you can view online by scanning the QR code.

All emergency repairs can also be reported 24 hours to the council by calling **0800 358 3783**.

Wrapping up Bucknill

any Ebury residents and neighbours have now seen the careful demolition process of nine buildings on the estate to make way for new homes. As we begin demolition work on Bucknill House, we want to explain the process and our safety measures.

You will recall that the process first involves wrapping scaffolding and protective sheeting around the buildings to enable safe working and to contain dust and debris from escaping. This is now underway at Bucknill House (the second to last original block on the estate). The setup of team welfare cabins and the removal of the marketing suite will also start.

In addition we have other safety measures in place;

Safety monitoring and mitigations

- Noise and vibration monitoring systems will be fitted to provide alerts when excessive levels are breached.
- A noise level management plan enacted, from limiting noise of vehicles on site, personnel, and no noisy works in anti-social hours (before 8am and after 6pm).
 Acoustic screens will also be used where possible.
- Special pads will also be installed that act as a barrier to limit demolition material causing excessive vibrations.
- Dust in the air will also be tackled using water jets and sprinkler systems
- Site lighting will be located and directed to minimise intrusion into nearby homes.

Site Access and Security

- Traffic marshalls at entrances and all loading/ unloading from vehicles carried out within the confines of the site hoarding
- Pre-booked and managed deliveries to avoid vehicles parking around the perimeter of Ebury Bridge Road.
- Scaffolding intruder alarms and CCTV cameras monitor movement
